

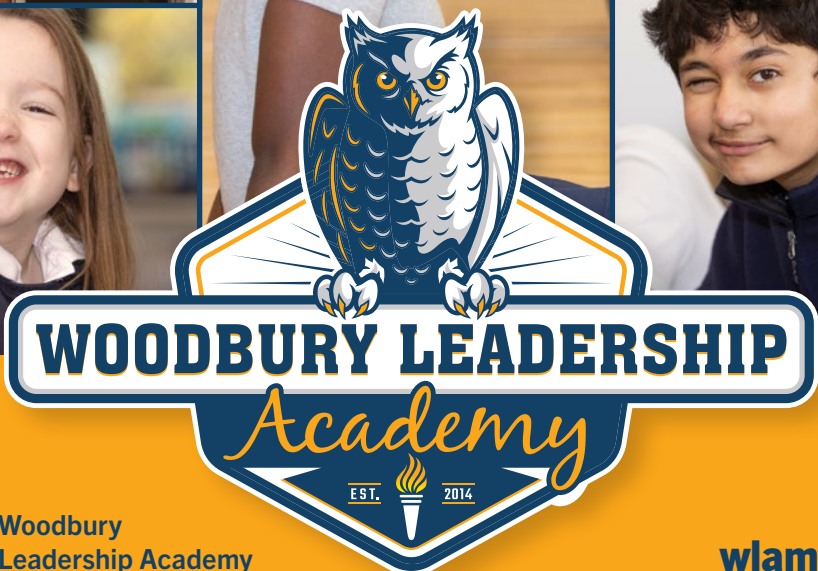

THE CURRICULUM:

GRADES K-8

We use inquiry based learning by teaching the rigorous **Core Knowledge Curriculum** — building strong skills in math, reading, writing, history, science and technology.

GRADES 9-12

Courses for grade 9 focus on **college preparation** — emphasizing college-level reading, writing, and note-taking skills.

In grades 10-12, students follow individualized success plans and may take PSEO (Postsecondary Enrollment Options) courses at participating local colleges and universities. This allows them to **graduate from high school with a two-year associate degree.**
